

## REVISED CONSTRUCTION PERMIT

The Orland Township Highway Commissioner, on the basis of the statements and averments made in the construction application, as well as the General Release and Hold Harmless Notarized Agreement does hereby issue a Revised Permit to \_\_\_\_\_ to perform the following work: Install a brick paver driveway apron at \_\_\_\_\_ according to the Updated Topographical Survey and Site Development Plan by Landmark Engineering LLC dated July 15, 2019 submitted on July 25, 2019 and incorporating the review comments from Morris Engineering which are 1) Erosion control is to be installed above the Base Flood Elevation, 2) No fill can be placed below the BFE line. The duration of this work is from June 1, 2017 thru August 31, 2019. The Clean Water Act requires that temporary erosion control measures be used during construction and permanent erosion control measures must be in place at completion of the project. This construction is subject to my right of inspection\* and final approval which will take place on or before August 31, 2019.

## Tree Trimming

Tree trimming is necessary to remove potential hazards to vehicular traffic, cyclists and pedestrians. Vehicles and snowplows on the road require a clearance of 12 feet above the street (even with the curb line). A clearance of six feet above the sidewalk is necessary for pedestrians. In residential areas, highway signage must be visible from a distance of 225 feet. If residents do not trim their trees according to these guidelines, Township workers will trim the trees.

**SAFETY FIRST:** Always wear eye and ear protection, and other safety gear as appropriate, when operating a chain saw or other dangerous tools.

## We Need Your Help...

A heavy snowfall can be frustrating because it disrupts the normal flow of everyday life. Below are some reminders that will help to make it more manageable for everyone.


- Parking is prohibited on unincorporated streets once two inches of snow have accumulated. All parked vehicles must be kept off the street for at least eight hours after the snow storm ends.
- Vehicles parked illegally or abandoned on streets are subject to towing at the owner's expense, in addition to being ticketed by the Cook County Sheriff's Police.

- When shoveling snow from driveways, please do not push the snow back into the street, it will only be pushed back when the plow comes through again. To avoid this from happening, please pile your snow in the grass area on either side of your driveway.

## Unincorporated Street Sweeping

Street Sweeping for unincorporated subdivisions is scheduled for Thursday, Nov. 14 & Friday, Nov. 15.

Please cooperate by moving vehicles from the street.

- Get ready now...If you do your own snow-removal, have your tools and supplies handy. If hiring someone, make arrangements early. It's tough to find someone in the middle of a snow storm.
- Remind school-age children of the hazards of slippery streets and sidewalks. Be sure they know to wait for the school bus to come to a complete stop before trying to board.
- Understand that the Township cannot shovel the plow's ridges or wind rows from residents' driveways, nor can the Township plow private property.

Whether you're responsible for clearing your driveway or the miles of streets for which the Township is responsible, snow removal is time consuming.
